Recently several individuals asked good questions about the progress of *Partnerships for Training Pastors*, so we thought this newsletter could provide those answers to a wider audience.

How are you and Joyce? We are doing well because we have a great sense of God's leading. All this is a new adventure with the rhythm of travel and home life being a work in progress. Our spirits are good and we are able to see God's provision and protection in wonderful ways. Probably the hardest adjustment is not being at Bethel Grove for the agreed upon period of transition. But even this change has expanded our appreciation for the uniqueness of each local expression of Christ's church in Ithaca.

When are you moving to Uganda? Our thought is to make Ithaca our home base for the forseeable future. In 2015, five Ugandan trips are planned and training trips to other countries are now being scheduled. We believe that God wants partnerships highlighted in more countries than Uganda, so we are not ready to relocate to Uganda.

- Pray that spiritual growth will occur through lectures, interaction and practical application of the preaching themes presented in class.

- Pray that God will build mentoring relationships between KBC men and University students.
