Masaka Schedule for 2017

"Partnerships" ministry includes a January leadership training session in Masaka that hosts over ninety (90) pastors and church leaders each year. In 2015-2016, we offered three Emerging Leaders Trainings designed to establish a biblically focused generation of young leaders.

2017 will see a more concentrated effort to encourage and unite both groups in ministry.

At our October planning retreat, the Masaka leaders decided to continue with the January training and extend it for a day. The purpose of the extension is to nurture the working relationships that exist between thirty (30) trained emerging leaders and thirteen (13) pastors under whom they are serving. Also, new June and November training events are designed to develop a network of leaders that will teach and serve the Ugandan Church in the future. January 16- 19 - Pastors and Church Leaders Training

- Large Group Study of 2 Timothy January 16-18
- Emerging Leaders join pastors who supervise them January 18-19

Early June – Strategic Training of Trainers

- Week long training of 15 leaders in order to train other leaders
- Five leaders from Masaka, Oyam, and Central Uganda areas will be selected to come to Kampala for five days of training

Early November – 2^{nd} Training of Trainers Session in Kampala along with a follow-up visit to Masaka.

Our vision is to encourage and equip less-resourced Majority World pastors through biblical teaching and resources. Beginning in Uganda, we will assist national church leaders and global mission partners as they nurture pastors and develop emerging leaders to the glory of God.

End of Year Goals

"Partnerships" Accountability Group met on October 21st and we identified several goals for the final months of 2016. Please consider ways in which you can help meet them.
