**October 16<sup>th</sup> Advisory Group Meeting** - On a rainy October day, we met to evaluate the 2017 "Partnerships" ministry and where the Lord is taking us in 2018. Joyce and I are very grateful for Susan Hay (a retired Ugandan missionary), John Kegarise, and Bob Jewell, who provide wisdom, counsel and support. Meeting results include:

- Continued commitment to Ugandan, Zambian and Indonesian partners
- · Renewed affirmation on developing emerging leaders
- Established an \$118,000 budget for 2018 (increase of \$13,000 from 2017)
- Budget increase includes a \$10,000 "contingency" for developing ministry
- Identified a Year End gift goal of \$20,000 to help meet budget increase
- Desire to explore "helping" partnerships in Haiti, Ecuador, and Singapore

**Ugandan Training the Trainers Project - December 2-7-** In a few weeks, I will be traveling to Kampala for this second session of the Training Project. Our study will center on the Gospels and the Lord Jesus, so that these leaders, from three different Ugandan regions, can teach God's Word more effectively to other Ugandans. Next year, our Ugandan partners envision three Training sessions (February, August and December). This 2018 investment of time and resources will require approximately \$10,000 to cover costs. Please pray for the Project's effectiveness in the development of these Ugandan leaders and for God's grace to be evident in their lives and ministry.
