



Thoughts from Joyce - Oyam Home Visits: After traveling a two-lane macadam road for several hours, we then turned off onto several dirt roads which we followed for another hour or more before turning onto what looked like a foot path edged by tall grasses and vegetation on either side. Jesus said, "you will be my witnesses in

Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth..." I think I may have truly found the "ends of the earth!" A young man appeared on the path as it diverged and guided us through the maze into the church and homes we were to visit.

We tumbled out of the van into the smiles, hugs, greetings and laughter of close friends who were so glad to see Dave again and to meet me - obviously solid, relationships have been established.

We ducked into a hut where we were introduced to the children of each pastor. We visited and chatted together before praying for these pastors, who are concerned as the elephants are ravaging their gardens, who expressed the need for logs to fix the thatched church roof blown off in a



windstorm, who will need school fees for their children, who are hosting an evangelistic conference in the area... These home visits solidify our partnership like nothing else can.

But even more importantly they tell me something about these men and women who are attending the *Training the Trainers Project*. They are spread out across the villages and are uniquely on the ground with a sphere of influence like no other - their hearts beat with the drumbeats of each village. They are literally bringing their training to the ends of the earth.

It was wonderful for me to be able to travel with Dave, to see this first hand, to see God at work, and to look forward to future trainings together.



Masaka Pastors and Church Leaders

During January 15-18, we traveled to Masaka for our annual Leadership training. More than seventy leaders studied, fellowshipped, and prayed together, centering our thoughts around the *Sermon on the Mount*. Jesus' words resonated in our hearts and challenged us all to rethink our view of righteousness and the Kingdom of God.

Several study sections spoke directly to issues erupting from false teaching found in many Ugandan churches. Sunday sermons often reflect

a popular health/wealth interpretation of Scripture. This message saturates the pulpits and local airwaves. Scripture's true intent, that addresses the corrupt nature of our hearts, is missing. Christ's teaching in the *Sermon* provides a paradigm that encourages us to look below the surface of common misinterpretations to apply the hope of the gospel message.

Also, something is desperately wrong when the popular "sow-a-seed theology" requires impoverished people to give money and other material goods to a "spiritual mediator". In Matthew 6, one discovers how the actions of giving, praying and fasting should reflect one's true relationship with the Father. They are not designed to gain man's approval and subsequently leverage God for material blessings. So, one's attitudes and actions must be in synch.



To challenge this prevalent emphasis on Prosperity Theology requires pastoral leaders to preach the true intent of the Scripture. Keep these brothers and sisters in your prayers as they serve Christ by proclaiming the good news of Christ's gospel!
