
The Mwenges Visit Ithaca






Edith shared in several Bible Study events and spent time with many BG friends.

Introducing An Indonesian Partner

Rev. Gabriel (Gab) Bria stands 4'8" in height, yet the reach of his pastoral impact is immense. His faith story is captured in the Fall 2010 Edition of *Word Alive*, the publication of Wycliffe Bible Translators of Canada. The article tells of one night when, as a unbelieving young man, he was staying with a Christian family in the village of Oenesu. After hearing the Bible read and observing the impact God's Word had on the family, he decided to steal their Bible. That act changed his entire life.

Gab began to read the Bible and came to trust Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Soon, he began theological studies that led to many years of pastoral ministry with GMIT, the Evangelical Protestant Church of Timor. Pastor Gab is still pastoring a church and often travels long distances to serve God's people.

In May, I traveled to several West Timor churches for pastoral training. Ben Grimes and I taught through 2 Timothy with an emphasis on mentoring younger pastors and church leaders. Every session was greatly enhanced by Pastor Gab and his ability to relate to people of all ages is a great gift.





As an elder statesman, he shared his experiences and thoughts on pastoral ministry. It was riveting to see the response of the participants to his interactions. The effect of his mentoring skills is seen clearly in a relationship with Pastor Yullius, the administrative leader of the East Amarasi GMIT churches (picture on left).

It is no mistake that as a young man God had Gab work as a government agriculturalist, because farming principles shaped his view of pastoral ministry. Actually, Pastor Gab is a biblical agriculturalist at heart. He delights in seeing the seeds of God's Word take root and produce fruit in people. Also, he served as part of the translation team for the Tetun New Testament that was published in 2011.

Gab takes great joy in worshipping the living God and being with him was one of the best parts of the recent Indonesian trip. Keep Pastor Gab in your prayers as he serves Christ's church in West Timor.
