Thoughts from Dave - There's nothing like Easter Sunday to enlarge one's gospel perspective. This year, my thoughts centered on Pilate's remarkable statement found in Matthew 27:65. In response to the Pharisees accusation that Christ's disciples would rob the tomb of Christ's body, Pilate answered, "Take a guard, go and make the tomb as secure as you know how." Can you see the irony and humor of that idea? Their solution was to place a seal on the tomb and guard it 24/7. But nothing could keep Jesus in that tomb and today no one can stop the power of the gospel, though many people and governments try.



Because Christ lives and has all authority, he commissioned his followers to "Go and make disciples of all nations." Making disciples involves building relationships as well as proclaiming the gospel. This truth fuels the ministry of *Partnerships For Training Pastors*. Establishing partnerships with Majority World church leaders and pastors requires time, planning and the leading of the Holy Spirit. God is opening up new opportunities for us, yet we are aware of the great need for your continued prayers and support.

Biblical Training Emphasis

In Fimpulu, our Pastor's training will center on an important theme. Because the Old Testament is often misunderstood, it seems that this study will encourage good preaching and interpretation of Old Testament Scripture, as well as emphasize the gospel!. In Oyam, we will consider the first four sessions. Please pray for these training sessions.

Christ in the Old Testament-

Between his resurrection and ascension, our Lord declared "Everything must be fulfilled that is written **about me** in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms" (Luke 24:44b). For forty days, he taught his disciples how to interpret the Old Testament. He emphasized the Old Testament's central message is found in his sufferings, resurrection and the proclamation of the gospel to all nations beginning in Jerusalem. By studying the first five books of the Old Testament, we will seek to understand the gospel of Christ better so that as we can live and proclaim it with clarity and conviction in a broken world.
