**November Visit** –During the first week of November, Daudi Nkuggwa and I, along with two Masaka church leaders, visited four Masaka area locations and connected with a majority of the August group. We listened, shared, prayed and encouraged each other. Their testimonies spoke of the impact that 2 Timothy and the discipleship materials had on their hearts. During our visit, Edson told of a new sense of God's work as his challenges were being met with God's grace. He noted that there will always be challenges, but he now understands what it means for his faith to grow stronger in the midst of adversity. Others chimed in regarding the impact the August training had on their ministry. We were so

encouraged and their response led us to a clearer ministry strategy in the future.

**Future plans** – At our Entebbe planning retreat, the church leaders of the Masaka region affirmed the importance of training emerging leaders. Plans are set for establishing a new Emerging Leaders group in April 2016, as well as reconnecting with this first group in August of 2016. By doing this, over 45 emerging leaders will be identified and mentored so that a new generation of men and women is equipped for their role in leading Christ's people. We are grateful for all that God is doing in this younger generation!

Our vision is to encourage and equip less-resourced Majority World pastors through biblical teaching and resources. Beginning in Uganda, we will assist national church leaders and mission partners as they nurture pastors and develop emerging leaders to the glory of God.

Time visiting Emerging Leaders in Masaka area was pivotal for future ministry because of the great encouragement that came from the young leaders who participated. The Masaka leaders and their wives met in Entebbe to plan for 2016 and the result of our time brought a clearer focus to our future partnership. This group of godly men and women are faithful servants of Christ and I am grateful for my deep relationship and fellowship with them and with many others in Uganda.

Also, a young woman, who attended Bethel Grove while at Ithaca College, is now serving for one year in Uganda. She traveled with us to Masaka to discover how she can use her musical gifts with our partners. As you can imagine, the trip was full of God's goodness and blessings.

On a discouraging note, KBC was burglarized by professional thieves and a large amount of money was taken from their safe. In that stack of money was the money allocated for Oyam training. As a result, we had to cancel that trip and will reschedule it for early 2016. Keep KBC in your prayers as they recover from the loss of these important resources and pray for *Partnerships For Training Pastors* as we plan for new global outreach in 2016 with the resources God gives to us.
