Our main study of the four Gospels runs from Monday -Thursday with an emphasis on how each Gospel portray Christ through their unique emphasis. In addition, topics units on leadership training, dealing with conflict situations, counseling principles, and an emphasis on Jesus, Man of Prayer will fill out the curriculum.

December 8 - **9 -** Wrap up details in Kampala and board an 11:30 pm flight to Amsterdam ultimately returning to Ithaca on Saturday at 9:20 pm.
