Training of Trainers Project (TOTP)

What a group! These pastors and leaders, from three regions of Uganda, were selected by regional church leadership to become theological trainers of others. Three times each year, we meet in Kampala for intense study followed by specific training assignments as the group returns to their village/town. Our times together have been refreshing and a deep bond of fellowship exists across tribal and regional boundaries. "We are in this together!" was a common refrain expressed throughout the week and pointed to a renewed realization of the shared grace that the Lord is giving to this group.

Each TOTP sessions includes study of God's Word. This one focused on *The Acts of the Apostles*, which led to discussions of present-day application of the book, as well as approaches to gospel communication today. An overview of Church History was a natural topic to pursue alongside ACTS.

In addition, the skill of biblical interpretation was put into practice as each person taught on a section of 1 Corinthians. They were required to provide a brief summary of the context, Paul's response to the issue found in the text, and then apply the passage to today's church. Each one had 10 minutes to accomplish this task, because the ability to summarize and apply is a necessary skill in the development of these trainers. As Oyam's Pastor Nelson emphasized, these "individual presentations made me learn a lot."
