**Spending two weeks in Zambia** gave us the opportunity to teach at a Pastors and Church Leader's Conference, as well as significant time with our Choshen Farm partners. The relationship that the Lord has developed is truly a gift from above. Our visit coincided with some ministry evaluation by Jeremy and Bethany Colvin, allowing Joyce and me to provide encouragement and objectivity in that process. Providentially, it was a well-timed visit and we are grateful for the loving and unifying time we spent together. Our commitment is to return in the fall for another time of training and relationship building.

The Pastors and Church Leaders Conference involved a three-day presentation of The Gospels and the Life of Jesus. Day One provided an "Overview of the Four Gospels" and a theological emphasis concerning "The Person and Work of Jesus". Day Two focused on the "The Calling of Jesus Disciples", "Jesus the Master Teacher", "Understanding Parables", "The Healing Ministry of Jesus" and "Jesus Confronts False Teaching". Day Three emphasized Jesus' "Journey to the Cross and Through the Empty Tomb." As one might imagine, there was good discussion in small groups, abundant questions about Scripture, and joy at discovering ideas for ministry in the churches. It is always a privilege to mentor youth leaders



during these Conference sessions. Pray for the emerging leaders of Mansa and Fimpulu.



For many who attended, a particular Conference highlight came on Day Two. Not only did Joyce speak on "Jesus the Master Teacher", but she presented a wonderful overview of "Jesus' Relationship with Women- One of Many Marginalized Classes." Joyce gave example after example of how Jesus reached out, touched, included, and cared for the "outcasts and sinners". The theme hit a nerve as many Zambian individuals are marginalized because of social position, illness, educational level, and gender. Joyce illustrated how the gospel pictures an extension of God's grace that is truly amazing to behold. It goes far beyond one's proclivity to approve or disapprove people based on their

personal choices or behavior. Following the session, several people asked for Joyce's notes, with one wanting them so he could preach Sunday's sermon on this topic. In the end, this Conference was all about Jesus and his glorious transforming grace.
