From Our Pastoral Epistles Devotional

Just as the United States completes an important Presidential election, Uganda is preparing for one in early 2021. The devotional considers 1 Timothy 2:1-4, where Paul urges God's people to pray for government leaders and the "shalom" of the country. Because prayer is part of the church's corporate worship responsibility, this theme should include our prayers for the world, as well as our Ugandan friends.

"First of All"

Read: 1 Timothy 2:1-4

"I urge, then, first of all, that...prayers...be made for all people...that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness." 1 Timothy 2:1,2b

Do you sense Paul's urgency? Is it important to you that as you gather to worship, you pray with a global concern for all people, including presidents and government leaders? Is it important to you that you embrace the needs of the *whole world*? First of all, he says, pray. Pray because prayer brings peace and peace enables all of us to live godly, holy lives where we can share the gospel. This is God our Savior's desire and it pleases him.

Are you lacking peace and quiet in the world in which you live? If so, could it be you are lacking in prioritizing universal prayer in your worship? How can you look beyond your church to your community, to your nation, and to the world at large?

Prayer: Think of two local, national or international people for whom you can pray. Petition, intercede, or give thanks for them.

Accountability Group Zoom Meeting On November 5th, we held a virtual end-of-theyear meeting to considered 2021 plans. In spite of COVID-19's impact, *Partnerships* mission will continue in 2021. Our decisions include:

• Commitment to continue Ugandan *Emerging Leader training through 2023.*

• Continue partnering in Peru, Zambia and West Timor by means of 2021 projects.

• *Purchase equipment for development and delivery of training in Ugandan villages.*

• *Emphasize writing curriculum as a strategic part of training Emerging Leaders.*

• Affirmation of Daudi Nkuggwa for parttime contract work as administrator of Ugandan Emerging Leaders project.

• Translate and print Pastoral Epistles Devotional into Luganda language.

• Develop ministry oriented-videos and blogs to be used as training tools.

Renew our 2021 budget at \$126,000.

• *Establish a goal of \$15,000 for year-end gifts to help meet the proposed budget.*

Ugandan Ministry Updates

Masaka Training of Trainers – Daudi Nkuggwa had a great visit with Edison, Moses, Masaka Region's two Trainers of Trainers. During their time together, they were able to preview one of the new training seminars developed over the summer. Daudi reports that both men were very pleased with the material and can use it to present biblical truth to other pastors and emerging leaders. Today, the Kampala Baptist Church (KBC) team is in Masaka holding a two-day conference with the existing Emerging Leader's group.

Tororo Emerging Leaders Training - As Uganda has loosened its Coronavirus lock-down, our KBC partners traveled east of the Nile River. The Tororo region is home to several churches of the Baptist Union of Uganda (BUU) and is identified as our initial area for expansion of training young church leaders. Two weeks ago, twenty young adults and other pastoral leaders assembled and covered the topics of biblical calling, principles for interpreting Scripture, and main Old Testament themes.

Our overall strategy initially is designed to

include local pastors, allowing them to capture the kingdom vision of building a new generation of leaders without perceiving the training as a threat to them. In the recent training session, a pastor approached Pastor Andrew and thanked him for coming to teach the healing power of God's Word. A second training session is scheduled for mid-November. **Pray for these women and men to grow in the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ as they are mentored and equipped for gospel ministry.**
