


January Update 2021

Questions at the Beginning of a New Year

What are some challenges facing our Ugandan training partners? The nation is emerging from a very difficult January election that saw President Yoweri Museveni win his sixth term in office. As a result, a nationwide curfew is imposed. This action will require additional days for travel and training sessions this spring. Also, due to the pandemic, the loss of employment and increased deaths of family members place a huge financial burden on Ugandan families. Into these situations, our partners seek to pull all



the pieces together in order to offer comfort and to strengthen the church through the growth of pastors and emerging leaders.

What's the status of the 2020 – 2023 Emerging Leaders Training Project? It's still on track! Daudi Nkuggwa writes that "The Lord has led us to do much more than we ever imagined in 2020. Even though we planned a busy year, we never knew that it would end the way it did. The Lord has been good to us on long trips up and down the countryside. Covid-19 has created a real panic for people to hunger and thirst more for God than ever before." As planned in January 2020, at our Entebbe retreat, steps now are being taken to move into additional locations across Uganda.

What upcoming events are scheduled for early 2021? In order to start training in new locations, initial visits are established to lay aside any misconceptions in churches and among pastors about the training of emerging leaders. Two visits are scheduled - one to Kiboga in the central region on February 9-11 and the other to Buvuma Islands February 17-18. The return of training to the Tororo region is scheduled for February 23-26 and March 23-26. Keep these dates in your prayers as our partners move forward toward the goal of touching all regions of Uganda by 2023.

When is it time for Dave and Joyce to travel again? Before our international travel returns, the pandemic must settle down. With new virus strains so unpredictable, we are uncertain if we will fly this year or wait until 2022. Until our partners and health officials say it is safe to travel, we will work from Mechanicsburg.

What training materials are you working on these days? Joyce and I are in our final editing of a new Titus devotional, our second Pastoral Epistle devotional for Ugandan pastors and Emerging Leaders. With the help of Harriet Nakato in Chicago, it will be translated into Luganda for distribution in Uganda. We also will review and update the Leadership seminar (the 4th out of 6 training seminars) by the end of February. It is our hope that these materials eventually will used by our other global partners in the future.

Any Changes in the 2021 budget? As in 2020, the Accountability Group set our 2021 budget at \$126,000. Changes in budget priorities include: 1) Increased program initiatives in Uganda and Peru. 2) Daudi Nkuggwa added as part-time coordinator of Ugandan training. 3) Increased budget for technology and video production. 4) Reduced international travel. 5) Reduced grant for Dave and Joyce. 6) Increased amount for resource development and printing.

2021 Budget \$126,000

31% - for Workforce International Grant and Housing Allowance

62% - for program Initiatives, travel and program support

7% - office, study resources, administrative expenses
