## Seminar 4 – Servant Leadership for Today – Part 2

Remember that Aubrey Malphurs and Will Mancini, in their book *Building Leaders*, speak of 4 core leadership competencies found in good leaders. Competence means one has the ability to do something well and efficiently.

A good leader understands the importance of each

competency and asks the Lord to keep them united at the core of ministry.

Character (being) – Soul Work Knowledge (knowing) – Head Work

Skills (doing) – Hand Work Emotions (feeling) – Heart Work
