
Session 2 – Growing As A Leader

God uses many methods to grow leaders for his Kingdom purposes. Understanding his calling on our lives involves a look back, a look forward, and grateful appreciation for where he has us in the present. The Lord plants us in specific locations and gives us responsibilities that require us to



depend on him each day. In these situations, God is helping us to grow into Christ-likeness as a servant leader. Is leadership easy? NO! That's why we must see that a leader's growth requires one to faithfully follow and obey Christ in each stage of our lives.

In their book, *Building Leaders*, Aubrey Malphurs and Will Mancini speak of four (4) core leadership **competencies** found in good leaders. They include:

Character (being) – Soul Work Knowledge (knowing) – Head Work

Skills (doing) – Hand Work Emotions (feeling) – Heart Work

<u>Competence</u> means the ability to do something well and efficiently. Good leaders seek to develop each core competency; asking the Lord to unite this "work" as their ministry unfolds. But what happens if one competency is emphasized over others?

- What happens if a person has character without knowledge or skills?
- What happens if one pursues knowledge without the others qualities?
- What about having skills without the others elements?
- What happens if someone operates ministry only on emotions?

Over the years, God continues to shape leaders through life situations and experiences. Growth does not happen apart from difficulties and suffering and it requires our cooperation with the Spirit's sanctifying work. In his Second Letter to Timothy, Paul reflects on God's active work in his life as he faced his death. Paul realized that God weaves all things together for the good of those who are called according to his purposes. So must we.
