Language An early August note and an updated report from Dr. Diana Weber of Language, Literacy and Life (LLL) shared details on the training of Quechua pastors. During Dave's 2019 visit to Peru, it was clear that LLL's passion for training Huallaga

Quechua pastors was developing and our partnership was established. In 2021, Partnerships for Training Pastors budgeted and sent \$5,000 to assist in the creation of curriculum, radio broadcasts, and the training of these pastors. Join us in giving thanks for God's work among the Ouechua!

Dr. Diana's note - "Pastor Training in Huallaga Quechua is happening, but not like we had expected two years ago, nor even as we planned in January 2021. COVID still plagues Peru. The government has declared another health emergency until the end of September. The Pastor Training Team has not been able to go out to communities and hold meetings with more than ten participants. In light of that fact, Felix began doing individual training in the regional capital with one or two pastors at a time. Another strategy has



been to use your gifts to publish hard copies of the manuals and handouts, as well as use radio broadcasts to disseminate [training] information."

"Recently the team (Felix, Grover, Telmo with a pastor in picture to left) was able to go to a group of 10 pastors in the "high" country. The town of Ishanca is located at 13,500' above sea level. (The trip takes 3 hours by truck followed by a walk four or five hours from the end of the road). These pastors are committed to teach what they learned in their churches."

The following message comes from Felix and was written to Dr. Weber, who shared it with us to share with you. "I am delighted that fellow Christians have committed to supporting the training of Quechua leaders, as well as for other language groups. A leader and new pastor, Braulio Echegoya, had received personal training in the Quechua materials Let's Teach (YACHACHICUY) and recently wrote to me":

"Brother Felix, we received some materials in Spanish from our denominational supervisor,

but we did not understand them because they were not in our But the materials you gave me are Quechua language. wonderful! Although for some pastors they are hard to read, [Diana: some pastors have only rudimentary reading levels] we understand it quickly and thus we can teach it effectively to our congregants. For me, the biblical studies in Ouechua are a great

blessing. I am also visiting other churches to share this material with them."

"When my supervisor saw how people are being blessed, he is giving me more opportunities to teach in other churches - using the Quechua materials and what I have learned from you."

Uganda Updates

During a recent 8-week government lockdown, it was impossible for the Ugandan team to train pastors in person. Later, after large group meetings were restricted to no more than 20 people, Daudi Nkuggwa, Dennis Kawesse and Elisha Tumusiime, traveled to Oyam for a second tutorial on the use of previously purchased tablets. These three guys form a great training team. (Daudi is the Coordinator of Ugandan Pastoral Training, Dennis and Elisha are an essential part of our Training of Trainers (TOT) group).

Originally scheduled for June, last week's tutorial brought together the five pastors from the Oyam TOT group. The pandemic has emphasized the need to improve communication and provide virtual training among these pastoral leaders. While several in-country internet challenges still remain, these tablets are an important part of our future training strategy.

In addition, conversations centered around how ministry was going during these challenging times. Their responses included:
